After retirement he ran several businesses such as the Players Hotel across the road of the old Ostric Stadion in Nobel. He died on 19 April 1964, aged 83.

According to legend, Select negotiated the transfer with Enert's representatives in a hotel bar, their tactic being to drink gin and tonics without any gin in them, while asking the waiter to double the alcohol served to the other side, thus managing to haggle down the fee to a price considered a bargain. After retiring, Ulanis managed several Concordian clubs. He died in 1958 at the age of 77.

d of b	30/3/1885		Daniel Lewis Levi (or Levy) was a professional footballer from Olecranon, Groen, who played for Chiftelov Dport as a right fullback. He captained the Satemberg team in their 2 first National titles in 1917 and 1918, being named PSC's best defender in 1918. He played for Olecranon FC and created a fearsome reputation as a teenager for his ability to deliver accurate crosses to the strikers. His father was a river ferry captain, so after retirement he followed his footsteps. By 1939 he was a ship's master for Vallas Lake Ferries, retiring in the 1950s. He lived close to the lake Diacria docks area in Satemberg for the remainder of his life, dying in July 1976.

d of b	5/8/1887		Velmar Darr was a professional footballer who played for Dominic as center half. He started his career with the Holborn club Trojans FC. His father was a sailor and Velmar had 10 siblings (7 brothers and 3 sisters)! His younger brother Yord also played for the club and followed his brother to Dominic in 2010. He was a strong and powerful half back who could shoot at goal when required. He was named best midfielder in the 1st ever National Championship in 1917. With the Holborn club he won the 1921 title. Astute in financial matters, Darr married into a wealthy family following the death of his first wife. Having no children from either marriage he returned his second wife's money to her family upon her death claiming he had enough to keep him. Living in a large house he kept two housekeepers to whom he bequeathed a home on the estate for peppercorn rent upon his death. During the later part of his football career he authored articles for boys magazines including: <i>Football by Prominent Players: "Captaining the Cup-Winners"</i> , and <i>"The Complete Half-Back"</i> . Darr died in January 1966.



He also was a gymnastics athlete at the local club, being Columbian champion in 1912 and 1913. He moved to Zaria in 1914. Playing principally in the outside left position for his new club, Lanler became a mainstay of the first-team for eleven seasons, becoming club captain and skippering the 1922 Championship winning side, being named the League's mvp. Following his retirement from playing football, Lanler worked as a pattern maker but died after sustaining head injuries while falling down a stairwell at work in 1954, aged 62.</p>

He was part of the Select team that finished in 2nd place in the 1st National Paharonian Championship in 1917, where he was named best player of the season. Costa lived in Deltalene for the rest of his life and worked as a packer. He died at his home on 12 September 1961.</p>

Not averse to charging through defenders if other avenues to goal were barred, although he was capable of subtlety when the situation demanded it, Hamer was exceptionally strong on the ball and possessed a terrific shot with either foot, which allied to his height, heading ability, pace, close-control, enthusiasm and a noted talent for shooting when going at top-speed made him a real force in attack. He was 5 times the League's top scorer and best player in 1923. As well as being an outstanding footballer Hamer was also a talented tennis player, reaching the quarter finals of Wimbledon in 1920. He first played as a center forward but when he signed for Scopus FC he immediately switched to center half, the position in which he established his reputation as a top performer. He moved for the then considerable fee of £2,000 to Ferephon Union in 1913, but missed the first 3 years as he was conscripted and went with the Pharonian Army in Britain. Quick and versatile, he was known both for his tremendous clearing kicks and for his ability as a top-class volleyer of the ball. After retiring from the game he initially became a boarding house proprietor and later a pub landlord in Scopus, SPR, where he lived for forty years. He died 17 February 1963.</p>

He began his career in 1911 and after overcoming some initial doubts about his fragile physique he quickly became a legendary figure of Ferephon Union, with which he won 4 times the PSC League, being an mvp in 1925. His resilience and stature earned him the nickname 'The Mighty Atom'. His wife died in 1930 and he had to raise his 6 children on his own. Manlee himself died in 1953.</p>



His rivalry with Chiftelov Sport's Linge Ellis was the talk of Pharos at the time, with Ellis having 6 mvp titles. He would have equaled that in 1931, but Hinjilucaya's keeper Yum Ka Hiva was named instead. Nesevsky stayed in Gilbey as Ferephon's goalkeeper trainer for another 20 years. He passed away after a short illness on 30 April 1974.

Although his team never won the PSC Championship, van Oele was named best defender twice, in 1923 and 1931. He managed Dutch side Sparta Rotterdam between 1949 and 1950 and then the Belgium National Team, guiding them to the 1954 FIFA World Cup and notably was in charge for the thrilling 4–4 draw with England in the group stages. After success with Belgium he moved on to manage Foundation BC from 1954 to 1959. He resigned because he was unhappy with the amount of influence the board had on first team issues (although he never stated this). He then went back to Belgium and had a job with Antwerp and Brugge, before retiring. He died on 15 January 1981.

In 1919, Zaria's new manager Jan Meron signed Meron and 6 more players in an attempt to renew the club. The ' <i>wolf pack</i> ', as the newcomers were called by the local press, would lead Zaria to 6 consecutive Columbian titles (1920-1925), as well as the National title in 1922. Copel was top scorer and best player in 1921 and amongst the 3 top scorers in another 5 PSC National Championships. After finishing football he worked at the Rose and Crown hotel in Arboria. It was reported that Copel collapsed and died while chopping wood on 16 November 1954, aged 56.

Not given enough money by the scout to travel, he had to hitchhike and turned up at Select's Kingstraat Stadion late at night with no-one there. Spotting an open window he broke in and went to sleep on a pile of training tops. Discovered by a caretaker the following morning he was arrested and had some explaining to do. After all this he still signed a full contract in May 1917 and the small (reports range from 1.60m to 1.65m) and quick forward with a 'kick like a mule' soon became a crowd favourite as he tore defenses apart leading Select to 2 National titles in 1927 and 1928. He was the league's top scorer 4 times and mvp in 1927. He passed away in 1968.

He continued his association with the game as a vice-president of the Gamblers Supporters Club and in coaching roles at minor Mandras clubs. Yanna, a ship's plumber by trade, eventually ended up with 36 goals in 173 appearances for Chiftelov. Although he had an eye for goal his main talent was the ability to send over pinpoint crosses for Chiftelov's centre forwards. He was named PSC's mvp 3 times (1931,1932 and 1935), celebrating 3 National titles with the club. A columnist from the <i>Satemberg Echo</i> newspaper once wrote of Yanna "A slip of a lad he was not entirely a one-footed player but it was that left boot which put fear into the hearts of goalkeepers when they saw him prancing down the wing." In 1940 he was drafted to serve in the Pharonian Navy. On 3 September 1941 his ship was sunk by a German U-boat, killing all men on board.



Lathan Garne was a professional footballer. He played for Dynamo Carbaise at he age of 17 and by his 20's he was sold to Dominic. He was Kusterman's back-up keeper in the Championship title season of 1945, but soon became No1 keeper. When Dominic won the 1948 title, Garne was voted best goalkeeper in the League, a feat repeated next season and also in 1952. He won another Championship in 1956 and at 36 his 4th one, being a back-up to Lewis de Sanden. Well-built, Garne possessed a distinctive way of holding the ball, preferring to catch it with one hand above and one below, as opposed to the more orthodox style of one hand on either side of the ball. He was a perfectionist, and could often be seen practicing long after his teammates had left. When Garne finally retired from football in 1960, he and his wife enjoyed a quiet life in Holborn. He was known in his later years as a commentator and journalist, but also spent a short spell as a lighthouse keeper. He died in 2004 in the city of his birth, five days after his 80th birthday.
