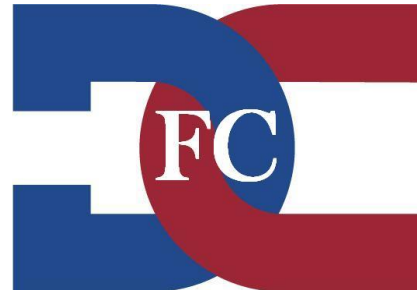


Dynamo Carbaise

Dynamo Carbaise is a professional football club based in Carbaise, Diceland, Pharos. Founded in 1871 as Royal Carbaise, they changed their name in 1920. They play their home games in Metal Stadion since 1920.



History

Formation and early years

Royal Carbaise Football Club was formed on 25 December 1871 by founder Jan Edvard Sydenam, owner of the local biscuit factory Royal Biscuits (the team was nicknamed '*The Biscuits*' until the factory shut down in the 1910's).

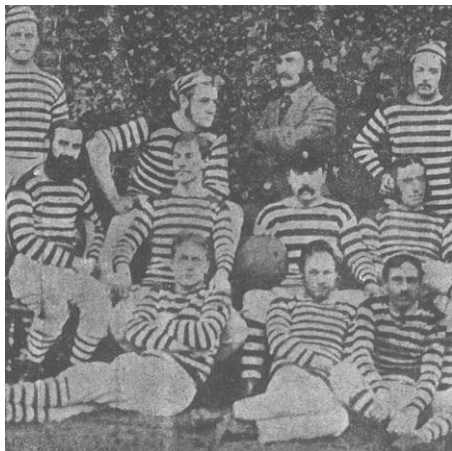


The club was a founding member of the short-lived Southern League and competed in the first ever championship in 1887-88, finishing in 8th position. They were also founding members of the

Association, claiming their first title in 1900, when they won the Dicelandic Championship.

They would win their 2nd Dicelandic Championship in 1908, with their big star Alav Restov scoring 36 goals in the season and Heber Slatter, their left half being named the best player. They also made the

double that season, beating Vitoria Bluecair 3-0 in the Cup final, with Restov scoring all 3 goals.

In 1913 the team toured Italy and beat Genoa 4-2 and AC Milan 5-0, narrowly lost 2-1 to Casale, before beating Italian champions Pro Vercelli 6-0

and the full Italy national team 2–0, prompting the leading sports newspaper Corriere Della Sera to write "without doubt, Royal Carbaise FC are the finest foreign team seen in Italy."

Carbaise were invited back for another tour the following year, but there is no evidence it took place. It is possible it was cancelled due to the imminence of World War I, which claimed the lives of many Royal Carbaise FC players, including Alav Restov and Heber Slatter. Attilio Fresia

moved to Carbaise as a result of the tour, becoming the first Italian to play abroad.

Name change and the new stadium

After WWI, the club were facing severe financial problems. The Sydenam's had gone bankrupt, the biscuit factory closed and the team was about to be liquidated. Just before total disaster, the Hadvik Metal Co, owned by the Hadvik family, showed an interest in investing to the club, after Arto Hadvik's initiative – he was a former player with the club in the early 1900's. The company saved the club, they changed the name to Dynamo



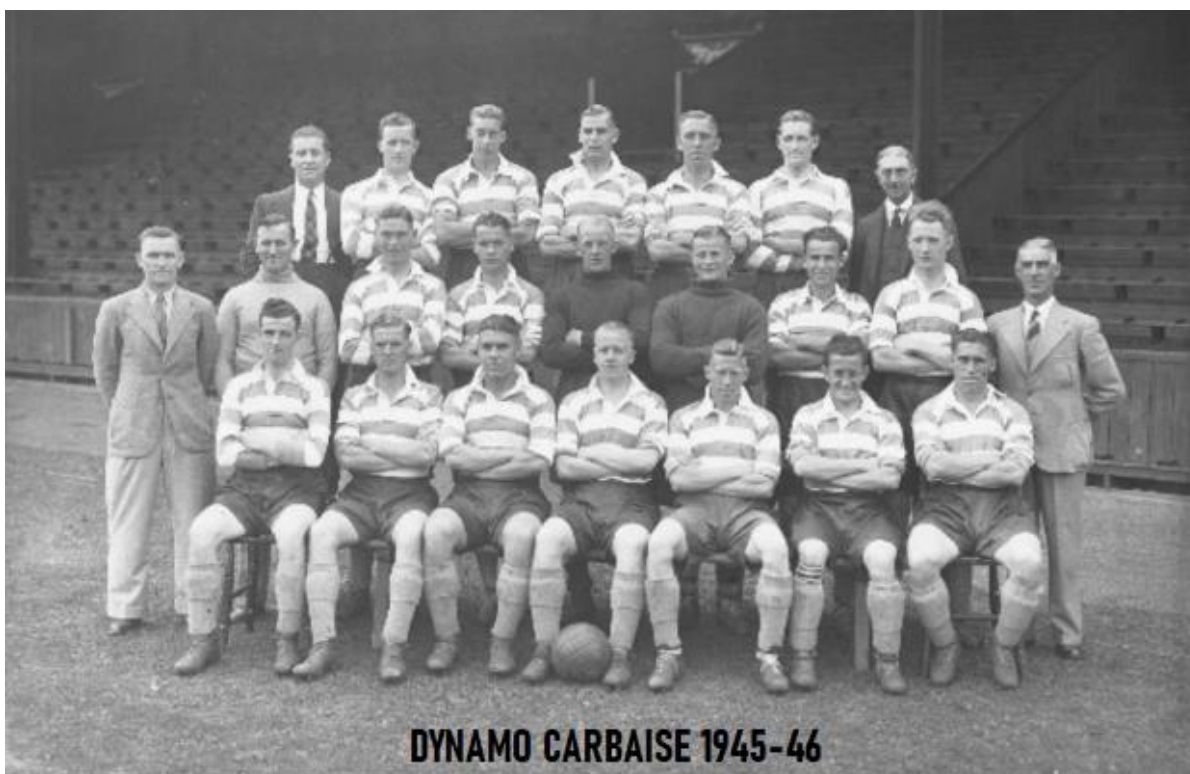

Carbaise FC and offered a new field for the team's home games, just outside the city limits, by their metal plant. The venue was named Hadvik Metal Stadium and Arto Hadvik became the club's new chairman.

Even with the help of the Hadvik company and money, Dynamo Carbaise did not win another championship in the 1930's and 1940's, coming close several times. Their best performance came in 1945-46, when they were runners-up to Dominic in the Dicelandic Championship, and since Dominic were National Champions the previous year Dynamo were able to participate in the Nationals for the first time. They performed well in the first half of the

season and were among the leaders, but several injuries during the second half of the season dropped them to 4th position in the end.

Dynamo Carbaise did not win another championship title until the formation of the PSL in 1981, but they had 3 cup finals during this period, winning the Cup title in 1950 and 1952, losing the one in 1958 to Rutugrian.

The PSL era

When the PSL was formed in 1981, Diceland's 2 spots went to Dominic for the 1st division and Rutugrian for the 2nd division, so Dynamo Carbaise remained in the local Dicelandic scene. They were crowned champions 5 times during this first PSL era (1983,1984,1985, 1987 and 1989) and they even competed in the PSL 2nd division in 1986, after winning the PSC National title the previous season.

In 2001-02 concrete stands for 20,000 people were erected in the Metal Stadion, changing in 2011, when another major overhaul took place, with the final capacity standing at 13,800 spectators meeting PSL regulations.

From 2005 to 2013, Dynamo Carbaise monopolized the Dicelandic scene – mainly due to lack of competition – winning all 9 championship titles during this period, but could not win any national PSC title, with their best performances in 2007 and 2009, when they came 3rd. When PSL expanded in 2013, Dynamo Carbaise were admitted to the PSC A, the 3rd tier of the Pharonian football system. They could not produce any promotion to the PSL divisions, finishing in mid-table positions, with their best one in 2019 (4th). In 2022 Dynamo Carbaise were relegated to PSC B and the next season to the local Diceland championship, only to come back in 2024, after winning the local title.
