

QUR Subclavia

Queens United Rangers Football Club, commonly known as QUR Subclavia, is a professional football club founded in 1882 in the town of Subclavia, Diacria, Pharos.



History

Formation and early years

QUR Subclavia was founded on 27 October 1882 at the Diacrian Inn in the town of Subclavia in a meeting called by captain Jan Tukert of the Subclavian Fire Brigade Regiment (The Queen Rangers Fire Brigade) and local doctor Ral Hikkins, a soccer enthusiast, who was appointed first chairman of the club.

The team comprised mainly by firefighters. Their first games were against other

firefighting departments in Diacria, Solaria and Aurora. In 1887 the team applied for the Diacrian Football League and they were admitted in the 2nd division. Soon the team used other players other than firefighters, from the area north of the Diacrian Lake. QUR were promoted to the Diacrian 1st division in 1893 and soon got their first trophy, the Diacrian Cup, beating Dynamo Lys 3-2 in the 1898 Satemberg-held final.

In 1910 QUR Subclavia won their first Championship title. The team featured great players like goalkeeper Stanel Aldous, defender Helnus Grimm, midfielder Istis Jedin and forward Escel Paril. This great team won the Diacrian Cup in 1913 and 1914 and the League for a second time in 1916, although many of the 1910 players had joined the Army for WWI.

couple of Diacrian cups, in 1931 against Zenith and in 1938 against Atlantic Union, with a penalty kick of Carl de Robi.

In 1944 QUR Subclavia, led by manager Derek Tonso, won their 3rd Diacrian championship and were able to compete in the national level for the first time. They scored 30 goals – with

Unfortunately, the team dissolved before the inaugural National PSC season in 1917, thus not competing in a national level.

Inter-war years and the 3rd championship

By 1920, Ral Hikkings Jr, also a doctor by profession, took over as chairman after his father's death. QUR Subclavia was one of Diacria's finest teams in the 1920's and 1930's but could not compete with the big names like Chiftelov Sport, Atlantic Union and Zenith Parietal. They managed however to win a

de Robi scoring 11 and Madi Senst another 10 – second only to champions AG Nobel, but defensively they did not do as well, so they ended up in 8th place. QUR Subclavia was the only team to feature 3 brothers in their squad, Farel, Eric and Ider Suman.

1950-

From 1945 to 1981 and the creation of PSL, all Diacrian championships were won by Chiftelov Sport (14) and Atlantic Union (22), with the

exception of Zenith Parietal in 1971. QUR were second twice, in 1945 and 1947, but as the great team of the 1940's was coming of age, they dropped to the middle of the Diacrian table. When PSL was formed in 1981, QUR were not among the Diacrian teams chosen for the new League. They were also worse from other teams that emerged in the Diacrian footballing scene, like Metalx Sacralia, De Graaf Lamina, Dynamo Lys and Helix Terminal, so they did not make any National appearance.

They won their next championship in 2004-05 and another one in 2013, thus entering PSC A in the new expansion of the PSL. They stayed in the 3rd tier of the Pharonian football for 2 seasons before being relegated back to the local Diacrian League in 2016. Another Diacrian championship in 2020 brought them back to PSC A and in the next season they missed the play-offs for PSL B by 2 points, finishing in 4th position. In 2022 they were 3rd, but lost the play-off game for promotion to PSL from Hinjioamaru on a penalty shootout. After a brief spell in PSC B, they returned to PSC A in 2024.

The Kogestadion

Kogestadion is the home of QUR Subclavia since 2000, replacing their old Noram Grounds. Official capacity of the stadium is set at around 6,000, but some estimate it closer to the 7,000 number. The ground was inaugurated in 2000. It had a couple major revamps, one featuring a new stand with multifunctional building and small seating section built behind one goal in 2009. The 2nd came in 2011, when 4 very uniquely-shaped floodlight masts were installed. In 2014 another new stand was added at another end, replacing a temporary tubular structure.
